POLICY CORNER

PROGRAM WITHDRAWAL

1. A student who finds it necessary to withdraw from the program must submit written notification.
2. The date of receipt of the written notification is the date used in determining if any tuition refund is due (see the Tuition Refund Policy section of the Student Handbook).
3. If a computer was issued to the student, the computer must be returned to Baker University in accordance with the computer agreement signed by the student.
If the withdrawal is temporary, the student should contact the Student Services office to discuss arrangements for returning to the program.

For students receiving financial aid through any of the Title IV programs must understand that it is the general practice of this institution to grant only one leave of absence per student, not to exceed **90 days in length**, within a **12-month period**. Exceptions to this policy may be requested if additional documentation demonstrates that such an extension is necessary. Students should see the “Withdrawal and Refunds” subsection under “Financial Aid” in the Student Handbook.

Truesdell Middle School– Mentoring or Tutoring

Truesdell Middle School is a Title I school serving a population with roughly 80% of the students on free and reduced lunches, a common measure of poverty. Our students, 6th, 7th, and 8th graders, would benefit from mentoring/tutoring with interested adults who care about seeing students succeed. Our After-School Activities Program (ASAP) regularly serves about 85 students Monday – Thursday from 3:20 – 5:00 PM. During that time, we would welcome persons seeking community service opportunities. You would be supervised by Truesdell staff. Activities might include helping with homework, talking about goals, drilling on multiplication tables, reading to one another, helping on the computer, etc. Additional opportunities may also be possible during the regular school day (8 AM – 3:10 PM), but those arrangements would need to be worked out on an individual basis. Mentors/tutors may be required to take a TB test before working with children.
