Work Completed Union Phase I...Dining Opens...

Work was completed right on schedule the week of August 19th and Baker students already on campus before the start of classes were able to enjoy the new dining opportunities afforded by the newly completed facility.

Rather than the former dual-line cafeteria style facility that had been in place since the Student Union was initially built in 1961, the new facility is "station-based," similar to a food court at a shopping mall. Students, faculty, staff and guests will have several daily food stations available that will offer meal choices that include such items as pizza, pasta, a daily entrée, vegetarian selections, grilled food, international offerings, desserts and beverages.

Initial comments from students who got a sneak peek included: "WOW", "what a difference," "this is awesome" and "cool" (I didn't realize that word was still being used but, what goes around apparently has come back around)! :)

Fundraising for the second phase of the overall project is just now getting under way with plans to have the monies in place so that work can begin as soon as possible on all the other upgrades to the building that have been planned. Included in phase two will be areas set aside for a café and coffee bar, where pastries, deli sandwiches and special coffees will be available. Office upgrades and renovations are also planned.

Just as a family needs a common ground, a place to gather, or in current genre, "to crash", so do the many members of **Baker's** community. Through this project the University is attempting to design, build and equip a union facility in which its family can connect, eat, laugh, play, study and meet. Early indicators suggest the new Union is certainly such a place!

There is a small round aluminum plate sunk in concrete somewhere on the Baldwin City campus that details the altitude of that exact spot.

Where is that plate located, what was the agency who conducted the research leading to the revelation of the altitude listed, what was the elevation on the plate and the date on the plate???

The Answers...

The plate is located on the south side of the west entrance stairs to Constant Administration Building. It was placed in the concrete there in 1965 as an official marker for the true elevation, 1,064 feet above sea level. The agency responsible for the measurement and placement of the plate was the U.S. Department of the Interior.

Baker VS Ottawa To Start the Season Again...

Make plans now to attend the continuation of one of college football's oldest rivalries...Baker vs Ottawa. Now in its fourth year, The County Line Clash, the new name for the BU/OU game, will return to the friendly environs of Liston Stadium for a 6:00 kickoff on Saturday, September 7.

The annual game between these two teams (prior to being put on the shelf after 1993) was once said to be the oldest such college football rivalry west of the Missouri River. The rivalry lay fallow for 16 years until Coach Mike Grossner of Baker and Ottawa Coach Kent Kessinger, who played with Grossner at Bethany College, got together and decided it was time to ractivate the rivalry with an annual kickoff game. The Braves won the first game of the resumed series in 2010 while the Wildcats have come out on top the last two years.

Deferred Gifts to Higher Education Rebound...

According to *Give and Take*, a newsletter written and published by the Sharpe Group, one of the nation's most well-known consultants to higher education and philanthropies, higher education institutions in the country have finally began to rebound in terms of the number and amount of deferred gifts made this past two years.

"Estimated contributions to colleges and universities in the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2012, rose by 2.3% to a total of \$31 billion. Leading the way to this more modest increase were reports of gift annuities, charitable trusts and other deferred gifts which were up 15.3%".

The trend to this increased giving in a deferred manner actually began a year earlier. 2008 saw an all-time high of over \$740 million (the present value of the remainder of those gifts) in deferred gifts before the impact of the recession the nation experienced 2008-2009 affected such giving.

It is estimated that with the continued growth of the stock market, low interest rates in the general market and general household wealth increases that the trend of the previous two years should continue. The impact of the retirement of baby boomers is also likely to spur increases to deferred gifts to charities that have the ability to return tax favored income over the course of the rest of their lives.
