Preliminary construction and work have begun in earnest at Mulvane as workers prepare the site for the 9,000-square-foot addition to Baker's current science building.

Work will continue through the winter with the plan of having the addition completed by next summer. The interior renovation work in the original facility will begin this spring, with the entire project forecast to be completed in late summer of 2012 and prior to the opening of school that fall.

School of Nursing Receives Max Re-accreditation...

Baker's School of Nursing received the formal letter informing them that they had received the maximum 10-year accreditation for its Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree program by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). The School of Nursing, established in 1991, is now reaccredited until December 31, 2021 but will, as do all nursing schools, be required to submit a mid-term continuous improvement progress report in five years.

Higher Learning Commission Campus Visit Preliminary Results Outstanding...

Due to the extreme hard work in addition to everyone's normal "day job" the University received an extremely positive report from the Peer Visitation Team in their exit interview with members of our combined campus communities. While the final written report is yet several months away, the chair of the visitation team revealed that it would be the team's recommendation that **Baker** should receive a 10 year reaccreditation! The following is a letter sent from President Pat Long to the University Community following the departure of the visitation team.

"Dear University Community:

As most of you know by now, the Chair of the Peer Review Team announced this morning that it is recommending to HLC the highest level of reaccreditation – 10 full years. This is a truly incredible accomplishment as we have heard many institutions are receiving far less during this time of transition to the Pathways model. The results of the Commission's visit did not surprise me. I have known since the day I stepped onto **Baker's** campus almost six years ago that we have something special, but it is always wonderful to hear that reiterated and validated by these experts in higher education.

I want to personally thank each and every one of you for your participation in this process. Our HLC Self Study contained a level of honesty and awareness that I believe was crucial in achieving this excellent reaccreditation news, and everyone at the University – whether directly or indirectly – had a hand in its results. Wandering Wildcats Trip: June 17-29, 2012...

This great Greek Islands adventure that is up next for the **Wandering Wildcats** has been featured each month for the past several here in the **Arbor**. With over 30 individuals signed up and a few more still expressing interest it is certain to be a most memorable trip. Each month I am highlighting one of the ports of call on the trip. To date I have written about Venice Italy, Dubrovnik Croatia and Corfu, Olympia, Athens and Mykonos, Greece. The next stop the Crown Princess will make is Kusadasi (Ephesus) Turkey.

"From the port of Kusadasi on Turkey's Anatolian Coast, one travels into the past. Nearby stand the ruins of ancient Ephesus, a major site of archeological excavation. The city was once a Roman provincial capital and trading center. Ephesus is also home to several of Christendom's holiest sites. St. Paul preached at the Great Theater and the ruins of Ephesus' Basilica cover the tomb of Christ's most beloved disciple, St. John the Apostle. In Kusadasi, whitewashed stone houses rise in tiers behind the market district. The palm-lined esplanade is the center of town life, with thousands of merchants offering wares to rival the Grand Bazaar in Istanbul."

Advantages of a Deferred Charitable Gift Annuity...

I am often asked if there is a way for a person who is interested in making a gift to Baker now and receive annuity type returns from the gift...but JUST NOT NOW. The answer is Yes! The HOW is through creating a Deferred Charitable Gift Annuity with the University.

A Deferred Charitable Gift Annuity has these immediate and future benefits.

- A donor or donor couple gifts an amount that is irrevocable to the University. In consideration for that gift they will receive an immediate charitable gift receipt for the Deferred Gift Annuity based upon the amount of the gift, the age(s) of the donor and the number of years until the Charitable Gift Annuity will begin making payments back to the donor(s). This receipt indicates the amount of the Charitable deduction the donor can take against taxes in that current year...provided they itemize deductions.
- In a future year selected by the donor, the Deferred Charitable Annuity begins returning regular payments (monthly-quarterly-semi-annually or annually) to the donor at a higher percentage rate than if the Charitable Annuity began making payments in the year of the actual donation.
- These payments are comprised of non-taxable return of principle and ordinary income based upon the age(s) of the donor.
- If an appreciated asset such as stock or real property is used to fund the annuity then there can be an added benefit of avoiding capital gains taxes or having the return payments taxed at a lower rate due to treatment of capital gains.
- Receiving these payments in a deferred nature can provide a steady stream of income and produce tax savings due to the donor's tax bracket being reduced due to (for example) being retired. These payments continue until the death of the survivor annuitant.
- The Charitable Remainder (the portion in annuity remaining after the death of the survivor) may be directed for a specific cause or used to create a permanent endowment fund.
