Work Under way on Phase I of Union Renovation...

Right outside my office windows on the “garden level” of Parmenter Hall there has been lots of activity recently. Construction vehicles removing walls and debris from the demolition going on inside the Union has been ongoing for much of the month of June.

Gone now are the interior walls that used to separate the main dining room from the private dining room and kitchen/buffet line. The entire space now opened seems quite expansive!

In case you missed it, **Baker** is in the process of renovating and enlarging the Union to bring it up to a standard now expected by our student population. It is envisioned that phase I (essentially the dining area) will be completed just in time for the arrival of students in mid-August. In place of the former cafeteria style buffet line, the new dining room will feature a number of food/cooking stations that will feature a greater variety of food choices and options (almost like a food court of a major mall!) New tables and chairs, lighting etc. are also tabbed for inclusion in the 7million plus project.

National research conducted on attitudes and decision making markers for prospective college students suggest that a visiting prospective student makes a decision within the “first three seconds” of a campus visit whether or not they can envision themselves enrolling at a given school. The recreation of the **Baker** Union will greatly enhance the University’s opportunity to attract a greater percentage of the students who visit the Baldwin City campus, much in the same way that the Boyd Science Center already seems to be doing.

Funding for phase one is essentially in place while fundraising for the equally important phases II and III are just now getting fully underway.

I hope that each of you will consider making a substantial gift to this critical project that will help **Baker** maintain its edge in recruiting the best and brightest students available! Thanks!

C). The Union was named in honor and memory of Sylvia and Edward (Lyn) Harter, graduates of Baker's former sister college, Missouri Wesleyan College, that closed in 1930. The Dining Room was named for Truman Allen, the trust officer of the Bank in Bryan, Texas that worked with Mr. Harter and played an important role in ensuring the Harter's estate gift to Baker was for the renaming of the Baker Union.

The two persons with the highest percentage of correct answers to the trivia question this month were Jim Foreman '79 and Don Thomson '65. Don also added these notes to his answers: "As I've mentioned before, what I miss the most is Centenary Hall. The partial basement in Centenary Hall, much like Parmenter's, was open. The stairs up to the top floor were roped off but I regularly bypassed the ropes and played my guitar in the marvelous auditorium on the top floor. It had wonderful acoustics. New Masters Program Initiated...

Baker has launched a new Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership degree program, designed to develop leadership skills in social justice, global citizenship and entrepreneurial spirit. The 39-credit-hour program components include critical thinking within ethical business practices, social responsibility, organizational diversity, group problem solving and innovative approaches to conflict resolution and negotiation.

The program is structured for adult learners to take one course at a time and attend classes one night a week at campus locations in the Kansas City area, Topeka or Wichita. The program, designed to be completed in 22 to 24 months, is also offered online.

"Baker has a reputation in the community for being continuously focused on creating a very personalized yet rigorous experience," said Brian Messer, vice president and dean of Baker's School of Professional and Graduate Studies. "The Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership degree program will help our students become effective leaders in their industries and gain the skills needed to create positive change at every level of an organization. The coursework is developed for Baker students and faculty to share a variety of experiences, enhancing the opportunity to learn from each other."

Courses include leadership fundamentals; leadership and organizational behavior; corporate social responsibility and accountability; maximizing technology in organization; methods of inquiry for business decisions; assessment of organizational performance; trend analysis; sustainability for future success; and strategic leadership.

Baker Trackster National NAIA Champ...

Baker senior sprinter Jeremy Gathright (Oceanside, CA) won the men's 400-meter dash in a time of 46.62 to become an NAIA National Champion, the first at Baker since Stephanie Nelson captured the javelin title in 2012.

Gathright also earned All-America honors by finishing second in the men's triple jump with a mark of 15.20 meters and eighth in the long jump with a mark of 6.97 meters. Congratulations, Jeremy!!!

Memorial Gifts...A Great Way to Remember Loved Ones...

Over the course of the past five months I have often been reminded of the wonderful and long lasting impact that Memorial Gifts make at **Baker**. During these past months, several individuals and families have contacted me wanting information on how to have memorial gifts from friends and family members, made in their loved one's memory, benefit the University.

Those remembered are often alumni or former students of the University, but not always! Memorials this year alone have honored alumni, former students, the faculty, a former member of the staff and a mother, sister and aunt of several family members who attended **Baker**.

On most occasions, the resulting gifts from such memorials are lumped into a larger **Baker** Memorial Fund that benefits any number of ongoing projects. Families who want to designate a specific fund to benefit (like a department, a capitol project etc.) can do so by indicating that in the obituary or through the funeral home or memorial program. A third potential beneficiary for memorial gifts is the endowment of the University.

As I have detailed on several occasions in previous issues of *From the Arbor*, permanent named endowments may be created once a fund reaches \$10,000. For example: A family decides to earmark memorial gifts to **Baker** and those gifts from 78 individuals amount to a total of \$3,700. The family can then add a gift of their own to the University totaling \$6,300 and thereupon determine a name and beneficiary (ex: "The XYZ Memorial Endowment for Scholarship") for the permanent endowment that will then be established.

The University tracks all such giving to memorials. Should donors provide appropriate information regarding name and address, they will also receive a receipt for having made a charitable gift that can be used if they itemize deductions on their tax return.
