### Greek Alumnae Council Recruitment Activities...

This past summer, the Greek Alumnae Council (GAC) encouraged sorority membership to incoming students entering Baker this fall. With funds donated by the Alpha Chi Omega, Delta Delta Delta and Zeta Tau Alpha House Corporations and their alumnae members together with the valued support of Baker University, the Council connected with 143 incoming students and provided informative materials about sorority life at Baker.

Over 50 sorority alumnae and collegians from all three chapters volunteered to distribute informational materials produced by the Greek Alumnae Council. Alumnae distributed orange "Go Greek" tote bags filled with sorority information at eight new student orientation sessions beginning May 30 and ending August 16. Additionally, four "Its Greek To Me" social events for incoming women and parents were held at Collins House.

The Greek Alumnae Council also mailed a packet of materials to all incoming women in mid-July as well as notes written by collegiate members welcoming the women to Baker and encouraging them to participate in recruitment. As students prepared for Move-In Day, an invitation to sign up for formal recruitment was emailed to every new female student with the link to the Baker website. University President, Pat Long, Jennifer Letner '93, Sorority & Fraternity Life Coordinator, Randy Flowers, Director of Student Life, and Kevin Kropf, Senior Director of Admissions, along with many other Baker Administrators provided invaluable support and assistance.

The Greek Alumnae Council was founded in 2011 to promote sorority life on the Baker Campus and provide an organization to unify sorority alumnae in support of Greek issues. Two alumnae from each of the chapters, Alpha Chi Omega, Delta Delta Delta and Zeta Tau Alpha, came together to study issues and develop strategies to strengthen Baker's sorority community. Alumnae from all three chapters have donated time and funds in support of the GAC. Over 80 sorority alumnae attended a GAC Spring Fling event at Hallbrook Country Club last April to celebrate their Panhellenic sisterhood and hear updates about Baker student life and current trends affecting the Greek community.

## How To Nominate an Individual for the Athletic Hall of Fame...

Every year I receive a number of inquiries as to the process involved with nomination and selection to the Athletic Hall of Fame. I have attempted as best I can through this publication and others including the athletics' website, *Baker Pride and Baker World* to provide such information to interested individuals. In case you have missed it previously, here it is again:

If you would like to nominate a former Baker athlete or coach for induction into The University's Athletic Hall of Fame send (or have sent on your own behalf), a letter (or letters) of nomination to me as follows:

Jerry Weakley, %Baker University Athletic Hall of Fame, P.O. Box 65, Baldwin City, KS 66006 or by e-mail to me at jerry.weakley@bakeru.edu. Please list as many qualifications, records/stats/reasons you feel your candidate is qualified for such honor. There are three categories for a potential inductee to be considered eligible for admission: As an Athlete at Baker and following college...as a Coach with a minimum of 20 years of coaching experience or...for meritorious service to athletics/sports and the University's sports programs.

For a nomination to be considered for the next year, it must arrive by December 31st of the current year. All nominations are held in perpetuity and the Selection Committee meets each February to consider the nominations in hand and select the inductees for the following fall's Homecoming induction service.

# Baker Trivia Answer For August...

### The Question...

What is the relationship between the Jamieson Film Company of Texas and Baker University?

#### The Answer...

The Dallas based company was founded in 1916 by Baker graduate and former member of the Board of Trustees, Hugh V. Jamieson. Jamieson was born in 1889 and studied engineering at Baker. He earned his education by having bought and used a motion picture camera, operating it with a hand crank. Following graduation he got a job at Thomas Edison's company selling Kinetoscopes in Missouri. After a fire at Edison he traveled the Midwest filming, producing, editing and showing films. In 1916 he settled in Dallas and began the company bearing his name. Through the years he was responsible for hundreds of advertising and commercial films, military, instructional films along with many other full-length feature films which at one time made Dallas the third largest film production center behind Hollywood and New York. During his time as a trustee he produced a film for Baker, based on the Baker Motto..."Let Him First Be a Man". Perhaps though, his company was most famous for having produced the first film about outlaws Bonnie and Clyde and for having produced copies of the famed Abraham Zapruder film that actually captured live the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

#### Have You Made a Planned Gift For Baker?

One of the strategic initiatives connected to the Strategic Plan currently being enacted across all of Baker's campuses speaks to the increasing need to document future gifts to the University through planned and estate/testamentary gifts. There are many advantages for the University to know in advance of plans individuals make with respect to a future planned/testamentary gift.

We learned this previous fiscal year that an accounting of such future gifts can positively impact a bank's willingness to make both short and long term loans to the University which cover gaps in cash flow during months in which tuition dollars are not readily flowing into the business office. We also know that interest rates on such loans can be more advantageous due to such information as well. A final advantage to the University is that it can make ongoing plans for capitol projects, academic programs and student scholarships when it has written information that support for these important considerations will be forthcoming in the ensuing years.

For the individual or family making such a planned/testamentary gift there are advantages as well. All individuals/families who notify the University in writing of an intent to leave a minimum of \$10,000 by their will or trust are inducted as members in Baker's Pulliam Endowment Society and receive special commemorative pins for their membership.

Another important reason for informing the University of intent to name Baker in an estate plan is that a University representative (usually me) will be able to visit directly with the donor to help them think through and plan for the eventual use of that gift...use as a memorial for a loved one, family member, former professor etc. or specifically what part of the University will eventually benefit: endowment, scholarship, capitol projects or academic programs just to name a few.
