NATIONAL SPEAKER TO ADDRESS CONVOCATION



Cokie Roberts, a political analyst for ABC News and National Public Radio, will deliver the keynote address at Convocation on Sept. 18 at Rice Auditorium as part of the University's 150th celebration and as the featured speaker in the Loreine Collins Dietrich Distinguished Lecture Series.

During more than 30 years in broadcasting, Roberts has won numerous awards and honors, including two Emmy Awards, induction into the Broadcasting and Cable Hall of Fame and a citation from the American Women in Radio and Television as of one of the 50 greatest women in the history of broadcasting. She and her husband, Steven V. Roberts, write a weekly newspaper column, are contributing editors to USA Magazine, and wrote *The New York Times* bestseller *From This Day Forward*. She is also the author

of the bestseller *We Are Our Mothers' Daughters* and her recent book, *Founding Mothers: The Women Who Raised Our Nation.*

She co-anchored ABC's "This Week With Sam Donaldson & Cokie Roberts" from 1996 to 2002. She has been chief congressional analyst for ABC News, a reporter for "World News Tonight" and other ABC News broadcasts, NPR's congressional correspondent and president of the Radio and Television Correspondent's Association.

The Lecture Series has hosted President Gerald Ford, British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher, Secretary of Defense Dick Cheney, United Nations Ambassador Jeane J. Kirkpatrick and newspaper columnists William F. Buckley Jr. and George Will.

Other events this fall to commemorate Baker's 150th anniversary include a kickoff dinner Aug. 20 for faculty, staff and the community, a Hall of Fame Banquet in Kansas City, Mo., on Oct. 5 and a Gala Auction on April 19, 2008.

Baker awarded \$1.2 million in grants

Baker University has received two multiyear grants totaling more than \$1 million from the National Science Foundation and the Hall Family Foundation.

The NSF grant of \$600,000, a rarity for schools the size of Baker, over four years will assist the University's research efforts of tardigrades, a microscopic animal. The Hall Foundation grant will commit \$600,000 over three years to develop a new general education program.

Baker and three other institutions — Fresno City College, Brigham Young and the Academy of Natural Sciences — will use the NSF grant to survey, identify and analyze the DNA of tardigrades, which are about .5 millimeters in length and are known as water bears because of their lumbering movement.

BAKER GRAD LEADS Goodyear plant

As the oldest of four sons in a close-knit family, **Billy Taylor, MBA '06,** was a natural-born leader.

After his siblings stopped tagging along with their big brother in their neighborhood in Fort Worth, Texas, Taylor thrived on his own. He confidently became comfortable in leadership roles as a crew chief at a grocery store and a team captain in sports.

Taylor is now a leader of a much bigger group. Since mid-December he has been plant manager of Goodyear's North American tire plant in Lawton, Okla. The plant, which specializes in high-performance tires and has a workforce of 2,700 employees, is the largest single producer of tires in the world, turning out 65,000 tires a day.

"I have always wanted to be in the forefront," Taylor said. "I think that came from being the first son in our family. My brothers followed my lead and they all went to Prairie View A&M University after me."

"We're grateful the National Science Foundation believes in this project and values the quality of the proposed science," said Randy Miller, assistant professor of biology at Baker and the project leader.

Called the most extreme survivor on earth by the Discovery Channel because of their ability to overcome severe heat and other elements, tardigrades live in moss and lichen. The animals have a head and five body segments. Each segment has a pair of legs, terminated in claws. Tardigrades, which lack

Taylor previously served as manager of the Goodyear plant in Tyler, Texas, where he was instrumental in making the facility the most efficient in the country.

"Billy has proven his leadership abilities in all of his assignments within Goodyear, and he is an excellent choice to oversee our largest tire facility," said Craig Kellogg, director of consumer tire manufacturing.

Taylor joined Goodyear in 1989 at the Freeport, Ill., plant, where he held several production management positions, including area manager, production specialist, manufacturing team leader and business center manager.

In 2001, he transferred to Kingman, Ariz., as plant manager, becoming the first African-American to work at the plant. In 2003, he was named a business center manager in Topeka, where he began taking graduate courses at Baker.

The Taylors moved to Texas in March 2005, when Billy was named production manager of the Tyler plant before becoming interim plant manager and eventually the plant manager. After relocating to Texas, he took Baker courses online and flew back to Kansas every six weeks to attend weekend classes at the School of Professional and Graduate Studies.

The Baker experience has been positive for Taylor, who lives in Lawton with his wife, Rachel, and two children, Alexis, 11, and Alexander, 6.

"I evaluated several programs before making my decision," Taylor said. "I had the opportunity to monitor some class-

Olathe Northwest instructor named state's teacher of the year

Josh Anderson, MASL '01, a teacher at Olathe Northwest High School, has been named the 2007 Kansas Teacher of the Year.

Anderson has been a member of Olathe Northwest's English department since 2003. Three years ago, he formed the debate and forensics program there. His teams are ranked first in the state and second in the nation.

"Mr. Anderson's intelligence, willingness to take risks and a global view of the potential that exists within the staff and students at Olathe Northwest has enabled him to embrace the opportunities that were offered here and to nurture the potential that other members of the staff possess," said Northwest principal Gwen Poss in a letter of nomination. "Josh's work ethic and capacity to challenge colleagues to better themselves have been a major factor in the development of the culture of success that exists at Olathe Northwest High School."

Foundation pledges support to archives

The Ethel and Raymond F. Rice Foundation, of Lawrence, has pledged \$15,000 in support to the Baker University Archives.

Historic items from the archives of the Kansas West United Methodist Conference and documents highlighting Baker's history are scheduled to become a part of the University Archives in the upcoming year.

Ziegler, Harris named deans of schools

President Pat Long has announced the appointment of Rand Ziegler as Vice President and Dean of Baker's College of Arts and Sciences and Peggy Harris as Interim Dean of the School of Education.

Ziegler and Harris are longtime Baker employees and have served in various leadership roles at the University.

Ziegler, who has served as interim Vice President and Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences for almost two years, started working at the University in 1981 as an assistant professor and earned full professor status in 1994. In addition to chairing the psychology department for several years, he has been Associate Academic Dean and Registrar, Director of Assessment and Institutional Research and Associate Dean for Faculty and Administrative Services. In 2001, he received the Kopke Award for Teaching Excellence.

Harris will serve as Interim Dean of the School of Education for the 2007-2008 academic year, succeeding Bill Neuenswander. Harris came to Baker in 1984, serving as coordinator of the academic skills center and a part-time instructor in the education department. In 1987, she became Assistant Professor of Education before becoming Professor and Education Department Chair. She was the first woman to receive Baker's Distinguished Faculty Award in 1988 and was named winner of the national Esther Edwards Graduate Scholarship Award in 1995. In 2002-2003, she was honored with the Exemplary Teaching Award.

Baker athletic director Dan Harris inducted into NAIA Hall

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics recently inducted Baker University athletic director Dan Harris into the NAIA Hall of Fame. He was honored for his meritorious service to the NAIA on a conference, regional and national level.

respiratory and circulatory systems, breathe through their skin or cuticle and the whole body acts as a pump to circulate fluids. Baker students Henry Dawson and Trey Ammons helped discover a new species of tardigrades on the College of Arts and Sciences campus in Baldwin City.

Baker's immediate plans for the grant include offering two students full-time summer positions that will include a two-week training session in California for students and scientists, and a plan to travel to five sites during the summer. The

grant also provides two to three part-time jobs during the school year to process the samples collected during the summer.

"The program includes independent student learning and experience in field work, laboratory protocols and data handling," said Miller, who has studied tardigrades for 40 years. "Students will learn to extract and sequence DNA."

The grant from the Hall Family Foundation continues a longstanding relationship with Baker.

"It will enable us to develop a program of general education that will provide a unique and valuable learning experience for all Baker students," said Rob Flaherty, Acting Associate Dean of the Colleges of Arts and Sciences. "It provides important resources to assist our faculty in their innovative development efforts."

In previous years, the Hall Family Foundation has funded the University's critical thinking program.

"We appreciate the continued support the foundation provides us," said Pat Long, President. "This will continue our vision to invest in a wide range of innovative and creative projects."

rooms in Topeka. I thought it was the best choice for me from an educational standpoint and practical standpoint. They present information in a way that you absorb and retain it. At Goodyear I've had to have extensive understanding of financials, how they work and interconnect. I was able to go back to what I learned in class and apply it immediately. ing numbers. Taylor credits much of his success to relating to co-workers.

"You must have integrity when you're dealing with people," he said. "You have to live up to your word as a leader, establish clear expectations of an objective and what you're trying to accomplish."

Pete Stobie, assistant dean of administration at the School of Professional and Graduate Studies, worked closely with Taylor in a managerial finance and executive leadership course. Taylor's management background benefited Stobie's class.

"Billy made our class better because of his experiences," Stobie said. "Our program is about real-life work experience."

In keeping with his desire for professional growth, Taylor someday hopes to pursue a career in international business.

"The world is moving to globalization and I think I need that tool, a better understanding of globalization and how international businesses function," he said. "Baker has provided me with the tools that are very much needed to achieve my personal and professional goals."


