# Greek Community

## Achieving Academic Excellence

A primary purpose of Greek organizations is to encourage and develop high scholastic achievement among its members.

- Each fraternity and sorority has set a minimum GPA that every member must meet.
- Each chapter provides resources to help members achieve academic success: help from other members, study tables, study skills workshops, test-taking strategies, and time management and class-scheduling assistance.

## Finding Time

The amount of time required to be involved in a Greek organization varies by chapter.

- Chapter involvement teaches students to manage their time and balance academics, work and other commitments.
- Chapters make sure athletes are excused from chapter activities that conflict with practices, games and meets.

## Making the World a Better Place

- Charities and service organizations, both local and national, have long depended on the dedication and time generously given by fraternities and sororities.
- Through the support of local and national philanthropies, fraternities and sororities promote ideals that enhance a member's college experience.





### Learning to Lead

Members of the Greek community are active in and hold leadership positions in every facet of college life.

- Sorority and fraternity members lead student activities, academic honor societies and special-interest groups.
- Every member is a leader within his or her Greek chapter, whether serving as an officer, on a committee or as a participant.
- The valuable leadership skills gained assist members well after their college years.

### Having Fun

The Greek community is an integral part of the Baker University social scene.

- In addition to campus-wide events, Greeks sponsor members-only activities, such as after-game parties, date parties, formals, Greek Week and mixers with other student organizations.
- One of the benefits of Greek affiliation is the opportunity to meet and interact with members of other student organizations.

Rent (includes utilities, fees and room and board) \$750/month

### Sigma Phi Epsilon

Rent (includes room, chapter dues and reserve fund) \$625/month

### Kappa Sigma

Rent (includes room, meals and fees) \$630/month

### Zeta Chi

Rent (includes room, meals and insurance) \$520/month

Monthly fees are paid for 10 months per year.

## Average Campus-Living Costs

Rent (includes room and board, utilities, etc.) \$911.50/month

# Sorority Cost

**Panhellenic Council Chapters** (Alpha Chi Omega, Delta Delta Delta, Zeta Tau Alpha)

## New-Member Fees (first-year students)

Range: \$1,966-\$2,301

Average: \$2,137

Payments can be made monthly, by semester or three times a year, depending on the chapter.

## Sorority Living Costs (for students living in the chapter house)

Range: \$6,930-\$7,658

Average: \$7,252

Payments can be made monthly, by semester or three times a year, depending on the chapter.

Payments made monthly for 10 months, average of \$662 per month.

## Average Campus-Living Costs

Rent (includes room and board, utilities, etc.)

\$911.50/month

Does not account for inflation or price changes

## National Pan-Hellenic Council Chapter (Zeta Phi Beta)

### New-Member Fees (first-year students)

Range: \$500-\$750/year

Average: \$600/year

### Member Fees (national, regional, state, and chapter dues)

Range: \$100-\$300/year

Average: \$300/year

First semester: \$250

Second semester: \$50

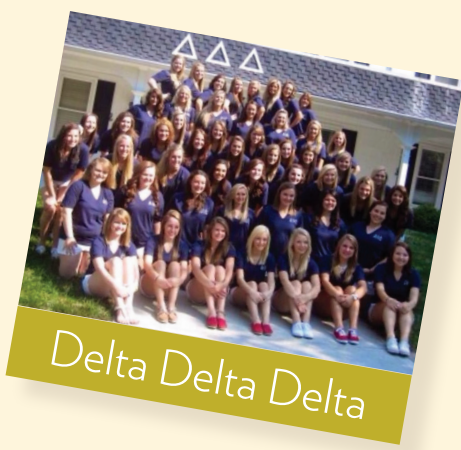

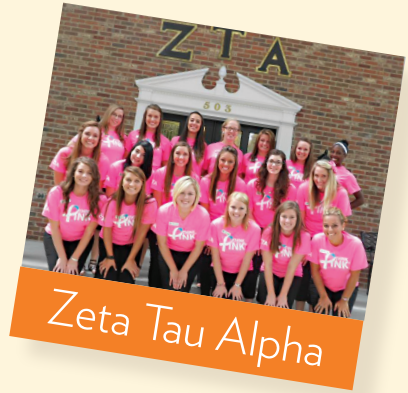
