#### **HI 231: 1945-1980: Decades of Change (formerly America before the Reagan Revolution: (*History Discipline*))**

This course closely examines the social, political, and diplomatic history of America in the intense period from the end of World War II until the election of Ronald Reagan in 1980. Special attention is given to the civil rights movement, the effects of Communism on American (including the Vietnam War), and the legacy of the Nixon presidency.

**EN110: Literature and Ideas: (*Literature Discipline*)** This course is a study of the artistic conventions and techniques employed by writers in order to structure written language into literary works of art. Selections are drawn from a wide spectrum of contemporary and historical works.

**PH 111: Critical Thinking: (*Philosophy Discipline*)** This is a philosophy course that focuses on how to recognize, formulate, analyze and evaluate arguments. Topics include deductive logic, inductive reasoning, predicate logic and informal fallacies. Attention is given to applying logic to problems and ethics and values, to constructing and evaluating extended arguments and to understanding the value of sound reasoning. Readings are included from philosophers in the Western tradition: Aquinas, Bacon, Hume, Mill and Clifford.

**RE 350: Bible and Leadership: (*Religion Discipline*)** This course examines significant characters of the Bible with emphasis on issues of leadership.
