

Foundations of Church Leadership

This program prepares students for graduate training in church leadership, especially a seminary degree leading to ministry. The program is not a major or a minor. It simply is a group of preparatory courses that will benefit students who wish to pursue further study in this area. Students of any major may participate in the program. Additionally, the program is open to students of any faith.
