Since 1858, Baker music students have had all of the advantages an intimate small-college environment affords plus the performance opportunities of much larger schools. Baker music ensembles enjoy major international concert tours every three years. This ability to offer students a wide range of musical experiences makes Baker's music program truly unique.

Baker is regarded as the **top private college** in Kansas. Located in Baldwin City in northeast Kansas, Baker was the first university in the state. It is ranked in the top 50 schools for **economic value** by *The Economist*, which is a testament to our excellent return on investment for students. Baker grads go on to earn the **highest average salaries** in the state compared to other Kansas grads, and Baker University is the **highest-ranked private** Kansas university by the *U.S. News & World Report*.

In addition to being an excellent experience, a Baker education is a great value. More than **97 percent** of Baker students receive significant financial aid in the form of academic and participation scholarships, grants, and loans. All of these combine to make a Baker education affordable!

The National Association of Schools of Music accredits the music department's Bachelor of Arts in Music and Bachelor of Music Education degree programs. The Bachelor of Arts degree emphasizes the study of music in a liberal arts context. This program of study is designed for students who want to double major or who plan to pursue a career in musicology, composition, arts management, or the music business. Students may choose to focus in performance,

music composition, jazz studies, history and literature, or interdisciplinary music theatre performance. The Bachelor of Music Education program leads to preK-12 licensure in instrumental, vocal, or general music. Closely aligned with the Baker University liberal arts philosophy, the BME program prepares exceptional music teachers who are able to involve critical inquiry and interdisciplinary relationships in successful music teaching. Baker also offers a minor in music for students who wish to take courses in music theory and music history, study in applied lessons, and participate in ensembles.



The Baker Music Department offers **many performance opportunities** in ensembles for students to continue their musical pursuits after high school. All ensembles are open to music majors and nonmusic majors. Baker offers Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensemble, Wildcat Pride Pep Band, Wildcat Drum Line, Orchestra, Concert Choir, Chamber Singers, Dixieland Band, Percussion Ensemble, Woodwind Quintet, Brass Ensemble, University Community Choir, and various other chamber ensembles.

The Baker University bands enjoy a **rich history** and **tradition of excellence**. In addition to the Baker Marching Band Festival, our band faculty host a jazz festival every November, a high school honor band in February, a pre-festival clinic for bands, and a trombone workshop. Our Jazz Band has performed with many world-renowned artists such as jazz trombonist Harry Watters, clarinetist Ken Peplowski, and jazz vocal legend and Baker alumnus Kevin Mahogany!

ADJUDICATORS

Dr. Derrick Crow holds a Ph.D. in Education with a concentration in arts integration and curricular theory. He also holds a Bachelor of Music Education from Eastern Illinois University and a Master of Music from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale. His research interests include music medicine, aesthetic education, and arts integration. Through research and pragmatic experiences, he is striving to create educational growth that encourages creative and intellectual exploration. He has had the privilege to work as a music educator at the primary, secondary, and collegiate levels. He has worked as a student teacher supervisor for the Master of Arts in Teaching program and as an adjunct lecturer at Southern Illinois University at Carbondale. He practices his skills as an educator and musician by teaching young musicians in Danville School District 118.



Kyle Hopkins is an associate professor of music and serves as director of bands at McPherson College. In his short time at McPherson College, the band program has experienced unprecedented growth and success, including being selected to perform at the 2018 Kansas Music Educators Association State Convention for the first time in the history of the school. Hopkins holds degrees from the University of Kansas, Washburn University, and Kansas State University. Before returning to college to obtain his first music education degree, he did graduate work at the University of Kansas and the Gornyi Institute (Leningrad, U.S.S.R.) in Russian language and culture. He also worked for seven years as a disability examiner for the State of Kansas, specializing in childhood disabilities. Before accepting his position at McPherson College, he was director of bands in the McPherson public schools for 12 years and before that he taught in the Topeka and Shawnee Mission school districts. Hopkins has been a board member of the South Central Kansas Music Educators Association and has served as the district's jazz chair. He is the recipient of McPherson College's 2015 Non-Tenured Faculty Teaching Award. And in 2011, he was voted USD 418's Teacher of the Year by its faculty and staff.

In addition to being a sought-after clinician and adjudicator, Hopkins has performed French horn with a wide range of groups, such as Mannheim Steamroller, Celtic Women, the Topeka Symphony, the Wichita Grand Opera, and the Kansas City Philharmonia. He performs regularly with the Salina Symphony as principal horn. He has performed or conducted in 38 states as well as in Austria, the Czech Republic, England, France, Germany, Poland, and Switzerland. Hopkins and his wife, Christi, have two sons: Isaac is a graduate student in trumpet performance at the University of Michigan, and Ben is a junior at McPherson High School who is an All-State and All-National tuba player and also enjoys power lifting.



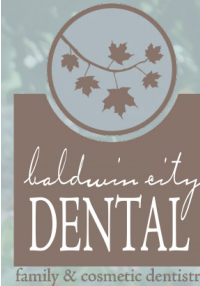
Jan Verboom is in his 10th year at Valley Center and 22nd year teaching instrumental music. He codirects all the instrumental ensembles for 5th through 12th grades at Valley Center. Verboom is a graduate of Wichita State University, where he performed with the Symphonic Wind Ensemble, Concert Band, WSU Pep Band, Jazz Combos, Percussion Ensembles, Steel Band, Marching Percussion, and "Shocker" Marching Band. He is a former student of Dr. J.C. Combs, Myles Mazur, Brad Bone, Dr. Victor Markovich, and he did his student teaching with Dr. Charles Menghini in the Olathe school district.

Verboom began his music education career as the percussion instructor at Wichita North High School and was assistant band director and district percussion coordinator in the Goddard public schools for 12 years before coming to Valley Center. He has been involved with a number of ensembles and organizations as an instructor or percussion arranger, including Goddard, Buhler, Derby, Olathe North, the Kansas Lions International and State Bands, the Performance Arts Foundation, the Kansas Masonic Band, and the Quad City Knights Drum and Bugle Corps. He also has provided private percussion instruction. As an instructor, clinician, adjudicator, and performer, he has traveled through the United States, Canada, and England.

He was chosen as a "Who's Who Among American Teachers" in 2002 and is a member of NAFME, Kansas Music Educators Association, and the Kansas Bandmasters.

In memory of Baker University graduate Jeremy Frye who succumbed to a brain tumor in 2008, his family and friends began the Music 4 Jeremy's Cherubs Foundation. Since its inception, M4JC has collected and reconditioned over 500 musical instruments and provided scholarships to music students and future music educators. Benefit concerts were held in 2009 and 2010 featuring the Mason Brothers, Bobby Watson, JCCC "Midnight Express," Shawnee Mission South Jazz Band, BAC Horn Dr. Combo, and other professional jazz musicians. Following the organization's theme, "Putting music in the hands of children and a lifetime of love in their hearts," M4JC's work has benefited students in need throughout the metropolitan area and beyond.
