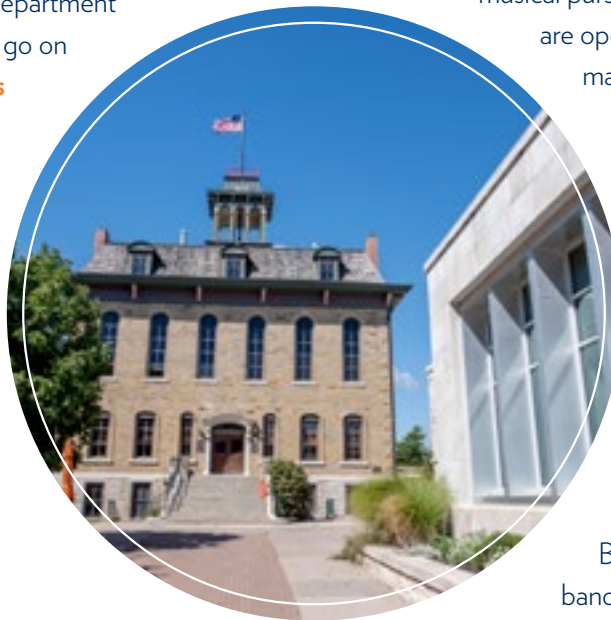
Founded in 1858, Baker offers the **highest return on investment** of private colleges in Kansas according to the Georgetown University Center on Education and the Workforce. A report from the U.S. Department of Education found that Baker grads go on to earn the **highest average salaries** among graduates of universities in Kansas.


The National Association of Schools of Music accredits the music department's Bachelor of Arts in Music and Bachelor of Music Education degree programs. The Bachelor of Arts degree emphasizes the study of music in a liberal arts context. This program of study is designed for students who want to double major or who plan to pursue a career in musicology, composition, arts management, or the music business. Students may choose to focus on performance, music composition, jazz studies, history and literature, or interdisciplinary music theatre performance. The Bachelor of Music Education program leads to preK-12 licensure in

instrumental, vocal, or general music. Closely aligned with the Baker University liberal arts philosophy, the BME program prepares exceptional music teachers who are able to involve critical inquiry and interdisciplinary relationships in successful music teaching. Baker also offers a minor in music for students who wish to take courses in music theory and music history, study in applied lessons, and participate in ensembles.

The Baker Music Department offers **many performance opportunities** in ensembles for students to continue their musical pursuits after high school. All ensembles are open to music majors and nonmusic majors. Baker offers Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensemble, Wildcat Pride Pep Band, Wildcat Drum Line, Orchestra, Concert Choir, Chamber Singers, Percussion Ensemble, Woodwind Quintet, Brass Ensemble, and various other chamber ensembles.

The Baker University bands enjoy a **rich history** and **tradition of excellence**. In addition to the Baker Marching Band Festival, our band faculty host a jazz festival every November, a high school honor band in February, a prefestival clinic for bands, and a trombone workshop. Our Jazz Band has performed with many world-renowned artists such as jazz trombonist Harry Watters, clarinetist Ken Peplowski, and jazz vocal legend and Baker alumnus Kevin Mahogany!

MEET TODAY'S ANNOUNCER



Will Cooper retired as the band director for the Baldwin City, Kansas, public schools after 35 years of teaching. During his tenure, the Baldwin bands consistently earned the highest ratings at state and regional festivals in concert, jazz, and marching band. He led the Baldwin High School Band to performances at Walt Disney World on four occasions. He holds degrees from the University of Kansas (BME) and Kansas State University (MME). Mr. Cooper has served as the state president for the Kansas Bandmasters Association and twice as the president of the Northeast District of the Kansas Music Educators Association. He has been the assistant director of the Kansas Lions State Band five times and the tour director of the Kansas Ambassadors of Music European Tour.

Mr. Cooper is an active trumpet performer in northeast Kansas and performs with the Free State Brass Band, De Soto Brass Band, and Lawrence City Band and has been the principal trumpet player with the Topeka Symphony Orchestra for 38 seasons.

Dennis Kerr

Dennis Kerr is in his 41st year of teaching in Kansas and Oklahoma and is currently the band director in Conway Springs, Kansas. Mr. Kerr has judged extensively in the Midwest region, teaching and adjudicating concert bands, marching bands, color guards, and percussion units.

Mr. Kerr lives in Conway Springs, Kansas, with his wife, Ellen, and has two adult sons. He has served as president and contest director for the Oklahoma Color Guard Association and as judges' coordinator for the Mid America Performing Arts Association and is currently the Marching Band Championship Coordinator for Kansas Bandmasters Association.

Mr. Kerr's professional memberships include Kansas Music Educators Association, National Association for Music Educators, past president of the Kansas Bandmasters Association, Judges Association of Mid America, Phi Beta Mu, and life member of Kappa Kappa Psi. He holds bachelor's and master's degrees in music education from Wichita State University.



Brett Martinez

Brett Martinez serves as director of bands and chair of the instrumental music department at Butler Community College in El Dorado, Kansas. In this capacity he directs the Concert Band, Jazz Ensemble, Show Band, and chamber ensembles and supervises all aspects of the Butler instrumental music program. Mr. Martinez also serves as the advisor for the Butler chapter of the Collegiate National Association for Music Education.

Before coming to Butler, Mr. Martinez spent 14 years as a school band director, including 12 years as the director of bands for Douglass Public Schools. He was responsible for all aspects of the band program from grades 5 through 12. Under the direction of Mr. Martinez, the Douglass bands consistently earned superior ratings at marching band and concert band competitions.

A native of Kansas, Mr. Martinez earned his Bachelor of Music Education degree in 1999 and his Master of Music Education degree in 2008 from Wichita State University. He was named Teacher of the Year for Douglass Public Schools in 2007. Mr. Martinez maintains memberships in the National Association for Music Education, Kansas Music Educators Association, and Kansas Bandmasters Association. Mr. Martinez served on the KBA board for over 10 years and is a past-president of KBA. He serves on the KMEA board as the co-advisor for Kansas C-NAfME, as well as the Southwest Division representative for the NAfME Collegiate Advisory Council. He is an elected member of the Phi Beta Mu International Bandmaster Fraternity.

Jeff Smikahl

Jeff Smikahl is in his 13th year as the director of bands at Olathe East High School after serving as the associate director of bands for the previous 11 years. Before coming to Olathe East, he was the director of bands and choirs at Jefferson County North High School.

Olathe East has a long tradition of excellence and has earned numerous state and regional honors for both the marching and concert ensembles and individual performers. Under his direction, the percussion program has received recognition as one of the top programs in the United States. They participated in the Music for All National Percussion Festival in 2016 and 2020 and were the only group from Kansas ever selected to perform at this event. The Orange and Blue Brigade have won several grand championships at regional marching competitions and have participated in several Bands of America Super Regional Marching Band Festivals. In 2021 the Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band participated in the Bands of America Pacific Coast Wind Festival at Long Beach State University in California.

Mr. Smikahl holds bachelor's and master's degrees in music education from the University of Kansas. He has performed with several regional ensembles and has also performed at the 2014 and 2015 World Series Games as part of the Kansas City Royals Thunder Drumline. He is a member of the Crossroads Wind Symphony. He lives in Olathe with his wife, Tracy, and their daughters, Isabel and Teagan, and their puggle, Peanut. Mr. Smikahl is an artist and endorser for Vic Firth.

Last year, the Marching Broncos traveled to Hawaii to march in the 80th commemoration of the bombing of Pearl Harbor. The band proudly took first place in the parade competition. The band also received I ratings at both the ESU marching festival and the Baker festival. This year's show is “The Music of Bill Chase,” who was a rising trumpet star in the jazz/funk/rock world of the early 1970s. Tragically, on the way to a gig in 1974, his chartered plane crashed, killing him and most of his band. His music, however, lives on in a Scott Boerma arrangement of three of his powerful hits.
