Exhibit I

Tuition, Room and Board (Baldwin Campus)

The following table and figure present tuition, room, and board expenses for students at the Baldwin campus for each of the past ten academic years, including the current academic year. In addition, the percentage increase per year is listed for each expense, along with the ten-year averages for these growth rates.

An examination of the ten-year averages for the columns of growth rates indicates that the average annual total increase of 5.4% over the last decade has been driven mostly by increases in tuition. These increases have averaged 6.0% per year over this period, whereas the average annual growth rates of room and board are slightly more than half that large (3.7% and 3.8%, respectively).

Looking more closely at the growth in tuition charged over this ten-year period, the amount has increased a total of 71.1% (\$12,300 to \$21,050). While substantial, this increase is approximately ten percent lower than national trends in college tuition increases over the same period. Using data provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the average increase in college tuition expenses nationally from August 2000 to August 2009 has been 84.4% (the seasonally-adjusted price index for this category within educational expenses has increased from 333.0 to 614.2 over this time span).

Tuition, Board, and Room



Enrollment Report (All Programs)

The following tables and figures present various views of Baker University fall semester enrollment figures for the past ten years.

In Table 2a.I, enrollment head count and student FTE (full-time equivalent)² figures are presented for the University as a whole, for the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) and the Undergraduate Programs within the School of Education (SOE) at the Baldwin campus, for the School of Nursing (SON), for the Graduate Programs within the SOE, and for the School of Professional and Graduate Studies (SPGS) and its various programs. In addition, faculty FTE figures and student-faculty ratios are presented for each group.³ At the bottom of the table, additional summary data for the University as a whole are provided (total undergraduate students, total graduate students, and those totals subdivided by full-time (FT), part-time (PT), degree-seeking (DS), and non-degree-seeking (NDS) students). Table 2a.2 provides greater detail for this information for the fall 2009 semester, including headcounts for students with a permanent address in Kansas ("KS Resident") and those whose permanent residence is outside Kansas ("Non-resident").

Examining the enrollment trends shown in Table 2a.1 and Figures 2a.1 through 2a.5, it is clear that the University has grown substantially over the last ten years, primarily in the context of headcount.⁴ Figure 2a.6 compares the student/faculty ratios for the Baldwin campus, the SON, the Graduate Programs at the SOE, the SPGS, and the aggregate of all four schools/campuses. From this graph it is clear that over this ten year period, this ratio has grown steadily at the SON, while it has fluctuated quite a bit for the SPGS and remained relatively constant for the programs at the Baldwin campus and the Graduate SOE. All but the graduate programs at the SOE experienced an increase in this ratio from fall 2008 to fall 2009, which has lead to a net increase in the ratio for the University overall.

Table 2b provides fall and spring enrollment data for the Baldwin campus for the last fifteen years. Given the nature of the educational programs at this campus, spring semester enrollment levels are generally smaller than those for the fall term, as indicated by the percentages provided. Optimally this "drop-off" in enrollment is minimized through effective retention programs and new student recruitment for the spring semester. The trends in these percentages are illustrated in Figure 2b. The sharp rise in the fall-to-spring enrollment retention rate for the headcount data from 2007-2008 to 2008-2009 reflects the introduction of concurrent credit programs at various high schools in the Shawnee Mission and Blue Valley school districts. The total enrollment in those programs were higher in the spring term (95 students in the spring vs. 51 in the fall), so this offset some of the usual "drop-off" in enrollment totals.

² Full-time equivalent for undergraduate students is fifteen credit hours per semester. For graduate students, this is nine credit hours per semester.

³ Full-time equivalent for faculty is twelve credit hours per semester, and student-faculty ratios are calculated using a ratio of the FTE data (student FTE / faculty FTE).

⁴ The dip in total student FTE for graduate programs in the School of Education and all the programs in the School of Professional and Graduate Studies from 2006 to 2007 was a consequence of improvements in the methodology for tracking credit hours within these programs.

Table 2c provides a detailed analysis of fall enrollment levels at the Baldwin campus for the last four years, and Table 2d compares the fall student/faculty ratios of the Baldwin campus with those of the seventeen other Kansas Independent Colleges and Universities Association (KICA) schools for the past three years (2006, 2007 and 2008). While the ratio for Baker's Baldwin campus has been at or near the 25th percentile for each of these three years, the fall 2009 data indicate that the campus is now just below the three-year average for this group.

Table 2e provides program-level enrollment totals for the graduate programs within the SOE and all programs within the SPGS for the last five years. Table 2f provides enrollment totals by state of permanent residence for all students enrolled during the fall 2009 semester throughout the University.



Baker University Enrollment College of Arts and Sciences and School of Education Undergraduate Programs





Baker University Enrollment School of Nursing

Baker University Enrollment School of Education Graduate Programs (NOTE: Prior to Fall 2006, included in SPGS totals)



Baker University Student/Faculty Ratios





First-Year Admissions Statistics (Baldwin Campus)

The following table and figure present admissions data for the most recent ten-year period for first-time first-year students at the Baldwin campus. The number of applicants, number of applicants accepted, and number of applicants enrolled are included. Three sets of conversion rates are also presented in Table 3: 1) the percentage of applicants accepted, 2) the percentage of applicants enrolled, and 3) the percentage of accepted applicants enrolled.

Notable among these data is the growth in the size of the applicant pool for the Baldwin campus (growing from 692 applicants for the 2000-2001 academic year to 1266 for 2009-2010). This has at least in part enabled a growth in the incoming first-time first-year cohort over this same period (216 for fall 2000 and 257 for fall 2009), though the growth in the incoming cohort has not been nearly as dramatic as the increase in the applicant pool.



Academic Profiles: Entering First-Year Cohort (Baldwin Campus)

Table 4a and its companion figures 4a and 4b present summarized academic credentials for each of the last ten cohorts of entering first-time first-year students at the Baldwin campus. These include mean ACT Assessment composite scores and mean high school grade point averages (GPA). Also included for comparison purposes are the annual mean ACT Assessment composite scores for all students taking the exam nation-wide.

The downward trend in mean ACT scores among Baker's entering first-time first-year students at the Baldwin campus reversed itself for the fall 2008 and 2009 cohorts, rising from 22.65 in fall 2007 to 23.06 in fall 2008 and 23.54 in fall 2009. The national mean score for this cohort remained steady at 21. Similarly, the mean high school GPA for this group of Baker students also remained steady at 3.48.

Table 4b summarizes the distribution of ACT scores for the incoming Baldwin campus first-year cohorts for the past ten years, from fall 2000 to fall 2009. The distributions are presented as both "count data" (how many student scores fall within each of the ranges) and "percentage data" (what percentage of the students who submitted scores had scores within this range). For both the counts and percentages, the data are presented within relatively small test score ranges (e.g., 12-13, 14-15, 16-17, etc.) as well as larger ones (e.g., 19 and below, 20-27, and 28 and above).

Figures 4c and 4d illustrate the percentage distribution from two angles using the smaller, two point score ranges. The first figure shows the distributions so that the top half of the distribution is more easily viewed, and the second shows the bottom half of the distributions more clearly. Visible on the figures as well as the data from Table 4b is the "fattening" of the lower end of the distribution since 2003, which has noticeably reversed with the fall 2009 cohort. The shape of the top half of the distribution continues to fluctuate quite a bit year to year; however, the trend toward a relatively "fatter" top tail that started in fall 2008 appears to continue for the fall 2009 cohort.



Mean ACT Composite Score



View of Top Half of Distribution



View of Bottom Half of Distribution



Retention of First-Time First-Year Students (Baldwin Campus)

The following tables present first-time first-year retention data for students at the Baldwin campus. In a continuing study since the fall of 1986, first-time first-year students have been tracked in terms of their persistence, as measured by the percentage of students retained, semester by semester, from a given entering first-year cohort. In addition to four-year and five-year graduation rates, six-year rates have been added starting with the fall 1999 incoming cohort.

Retention data are presented for all first-year students in each entering cohort (Table 5a) as well as for the following subgroups: men (Table 5b), women (Table 5c), Greek-affiliated students (Table 5d), non-Greeks (Table 5e), athletes (Table 5f), non-athletes (Table 5g), football players (Table 5h), minority students (Table 5i), major scholarship recipients (Table 5j), and Standards Committee admitted students (students admitted with academic conditions; Table 5k).

Figures 5a and 5b illustrate selected retention percentages of particular interest. Figure 5a presents semester-by-semester mean retention percentages calculated for all entering cohorts included in the study, along with four-year, five-year, and six-year average graduation rates (41.9%, 55.6% and 59.0%, respectively). Figure 5b shows average freshman-to-sophomore retention percentages by year of entering cohort. After a noticeably lower retention rate for the 2007 cohort (72.8%), the rate for the fall 2008 cohort (74.9%) is much closer to the long-run average rate of 75.2%.

Table 5I summarizes the four-year and five-year graduation rates for all students and subgroups since 1996 (ten years of cohorts). It also includes six-year graduation rates starting with the fall 1999 cohort. Figures 5c through 5e illustrate the multi-year averages included within this summary table.

An examination of all of these figures indicates that the graduation trends at the Baldwin campus have been relatively stable over the depicted time period, particularly when looking at the rates for all students combined and the larger subgroups (less volatile from year to year compared to the percentages for "small" subgroups like football players or committee-admitted students).

Mean Percentages for the Baldwin Campus, 1986-2009




(Average from 1996 to 2005)



(Average from 1996 to 2004)



(Average from 1999 to 2003)



Retention of Transfer Students (Baldwin Campus)

The following table and figure present transfer retention data for the Baldwin campus since the fall of 1993. Tracking transfer students is different than tracking first-time first-year students in that the "expected" time until graduation varies from student to student. Therefore, the most meaningful retention statistics regarding transfer students are: 1) the number and percentage who graduate; 2) the number and percentage who do not graduate; and 3) the number and percentage of those who persist but have not yet graduated.

The number and percentages of those within each entering "transfer cohort" who have graduated or who have neither graduated nor returned are listed in the last two columns of Table 6. The number and percentage of transfer students who have returned but have not yet graduated are tracked along the middle columns of the table according to how many semesters these students have been at Baker. The average graduation and non-returning rates presented in the lower right corner of the table only summarize those cohorts considered "complete," which occurs when it has been ten semesters since the cohort entered Baker. The benchmark of ten semesters is used because by this point, with only an occasional exception, all of the students have either graduated or are no longer enrolled at Baker.

Figure 6 compares the graduation and non-returning rates for each of the "completed" cohorts (fall 1993 through spring 2005). Examining these rates for the four most recent "completed" fall cohorts (2001, 2002, 2003, and 2004) shows that the graduation rate for each has been fairly constant with the most recent two cohorts graduating a bit higher than previous ones (54.3%, 55.3%, 59.5%, and 64.9%, respectively). Graduation rates for smaller spring cohorts tend to vary quite a bit more from year to year, since relatively small changes in totals have a larger impact on these percentages given the smaller original cohort sizes.



Ethnicity and Gender Distributions (All Programs)

The following tables and figures present and illustrate ethnicity and gender distributions for students at the Baldwin campus and for students enrolled in programs throughout the University. These include headcount totals and percentage distributions.

The first two tables and figures focus on data for the Baldwin campus from fall 2005 through fall 2009. Table 7a utilizes data for just the incoming first-year cohorts, and Table 7b depicts data for all students at the Baldwin campus. Figures 7a and 7b illustrate the five-year trends in the percentage distributions for the three largest ethnicity categories (black, Hispanic and white) and for females, as described in the tables.

An examination of these trends indicates that the proportion of students within the fall 2009 cohort who self-identify as black (7.4%), as Hispanic (1.6%) or as white (78.2%) is lower for this cohort than the five-year average (9.0%, 2.3% and 80.8%, respectively). By contrast, those who self-identify as Native-American/Alaskan Native (1.9%) or who did not self-report this information (5.1%) are noticeably higher than the five-year averages for these percentages (0.9% and 1.8%, respectively). Furthermore, reversing long-standing trends at the Baldwin Campus (and nationally⁵), this year's first-year cohort is majority male (53.3%). Much of the large increase in the male population within the first-year cohort can be attributed to the introduction of a men's wrestling program at the Baldwin Campus.

Table and Figure 7c depict data for the fall 2009 semester for all students within the University, both headcount totals and percentage distributions. Comparisons among the four schools and campuses depicted indicate that the percentage of black students is highest at the SPGS (11.1%) and lowest within the SOE Graduate Programs (2.9%). The highest percentage of Hispanic students is found within the SPGS (4.1%), while only 1.4% and 1.8% of the students at the SON and the SOE Graduate Programs, respectively, are Hispanic.

The SPGS would also seem to have a markedly smaller percentage of white students (69.1%), compared to 81.5% at the Baldwin campus, 85.2% at the SON, and 85.2% within the Graduate Programs at the SOE. However, it should be noted that the SPGS and the Graduate Programs at the SOE both have a relatively large percentage of students who did not identify an ethnicity (9.8% and 8.1%, respectively), compared to 2.2% and 0.6% at the Baldwin campus and the SON, so this should be viewed with caution.

In terms of gender distributions within the University, the SON and the Graduate Programs within the SOE both have relatively female student populations (91.4% and 75.8%, respectively), while the Baldwin campus (at 56.6%) and the SPGS (at 55.1%) more closely match national gender distribution trends in higher education.



Selected Gender and Ethnicity Distributions All Students - Baldwin Campus 2005 - 2009



Selected Gender and Ethnicity Distributions All Programs Fall 2009



Distribution of Majors and Degrees (All Programs)

The following two tables list the distribution of majors produced by Baker's Baldwin campus students and the distribution of different degrees awarded to CAS, SOE, SON, and SPGS students over the most recent five-year period. Table 8a includes the percentage of majors earned at the Baldwin campus within each of the various areas of study during the most recent five-year tracking period. Similarly, Table 8b includes the number and percentage of all graduating students receiving each degree as well as an overall breakdown of degree type (Associate, Bachelor, Master, Doctorate) for the same time period.

Examining the trends in the data for graduates at the Baldwin campus, one interesting development is the apparent increase in the number of students who are graduating with multiple degrees (see the bottom two rows shown on Table 8a). Part of this increase is the development of a new major in Secondary Education, which can only be earned in conjunction with another degree (in preparation for teacher licensure at the secondary school level).

As indicated by the data on Table 8b, trends within the University as a whole show a continuing increase in the percentage of Master's level degrees earned (61.1%, 59.2%, 61.9% and 61.1% of all degrees granted during the last four years, respectively, compared to 52.4% during 2004-2005). Most of this increase has been created from a substantial increase in the percentage of Master of Arts in Education graduates, which has grown from 13.1% of total degrees awarded during 2004-2005 to 22.4% during 2008-2009. For the twelve-month periods of 2006-2007 and 2007-2008, the Master of Arts in Education degree was the degree most often granted by Baker. During the most recent twelve month period, this distinction is held by the Master of Business Administration (24.6% of all degrees granted).

University Employment Profile (CAS, SOE, SPGS)

The following table and figures present gender distributions by employment category of full-time Baker University employees for the past ten academic years. Only CAS, SOE and SPGS employees are included because SON employees are not included on the regular University payroll. Employment categories include faculty, administrators, and support staff.

The data for total employees for the most recent period reported (September 2009) reveal the impact of university-wide staff and administrative lay-offs during the last twelve months, with total employment falling from 331 in September 2008 to 284 in September 2009, a 14.2% reduction. Examining this reduction in terms of employee gender, the total number of male employees fell 11.3% and the total number of female employees fell 16.2%. As a consequence, the proportion of male employees at Baker grew from 40.2% to 41.5% from September 2008 to 2009.

In terms of the mix of employees based on position category, from 2008 to 2009 the proportion represented by support staff decreased from 27.2% in 2008 of total employees to 24.3% in 2009. The proportion of administrative positions among total employees remained nearly stable, falling slightly from 45.6% in 2008 to 45.4% in 2009. By contrast, the proportion of faculty employees rose, from 27.2% of total employees in 2008 to 30.3% in 2009.

Full-Time Male Employees



Full-Time Female Employees



Faculty Profile (All Programs)

Tables 10a through 10e present a breakdown of full-time teaching and learning resources faculty by rank and tenure status, as well as an overall count of part-time faculty. Data are presented as of the fall semester for the Baldwin Campus, SON, SPGS, and Graduate Programs within the SOE for the most recent five-year period, as well as a composite table summarizing these data for all four schools. Table 10f summarizes the gender and ethnicity distributions for full-time teaching faculty within these schools and campuses for fall 2009.

Trends in full-time faculty indicate that the University total remained flat compared to last fall, staying at 94 in fall 2009. Forty-five of the full-time faculty within the University as of fall 2009 are tenured, one fewer than the total in 2008. As was the case in 2008, one of the tenured faculty teaches at the SON and two are at the SPGS. The remaining 42 teach at the Baldwin campus.

In terms of the gender and ethnicity distributions for full-time teaching faculty within the University as of fall 2009, 52.9% of these faculty are female (46 of 87), while 96.6% self-identify as white (84 of 87). Examining the gender distribution within each of the four schools/campuses represented, the Baldwin campus has a majority of male full-time teaching faculty, whereas all of the faculty at the SON are female and the gender distribution is evenly split at the SPGS and the Graduate Programs within the SOE (exactly 50% female).

Departmental Credit-Hour Production (Baldwin Campus)

Table II (actually, a set of tables) presents a semester-by-semester report of departmental and program credit hour load production at the Baldwin campus for the past ten academic years, including data for the high school concurrent credit programs begun during 2008-2009 (provided at end).

Included are:

- I) the number of credit hours produced by each department (or program) per semester and per academic year,⁶
- 2) the faculty FTE⁷ for each department/program per semester,
- 3) the number of credit hours produced per FTE faculty member by each department/program per semester and per academic year,
- 4) 10-year averages for each of the above,
- the percent increase or decrease from the preceding year in both total credit hours produced and credit hours produced per FTE faculty for each department/program per academic year, and
- 6) the University rank in both total credit hours produced and credit hours produced per FTE faculty for each department/program per academic year.

Examining the percentage changes in total credit hours produced for the year from 2007-2008 to 2008-2009, about half the departments/programs experienced a positive change, which is nearly offset by similar-sized negative changes for the other half of departments/programs (net change is only 1.2%).

The rankings in terms of both total credit hours produced and faculty credit hours produced per FTE faculty remain relatively stable, with few departments/programs experiencing any change in rankings from 2007-2008 to 2008-2009 that exceed more than one or two units.

⁶ The large change in total credit hours produced by the FYE program starting in fall 2007 is a consequence of curricular changes within the program whereby the primary "First-Year" and "Transfer-Year" courses changed from I credit hour (FY 100 and FY 200) to two credit hours (FY 150 and FY 250).

⁷ Faculty FTE, or full-time equivalent, is a twelve credit hour teaching load per semester.

Average Faculty Salaries (Baldwin Campus)

Table 12 provides the past five years of faculty salary data for all full-time instructional faculty at the Baldwin campus who are on 9 or 10 month contracts (data as of November 1 of each year). These data are "salary only"—they do not include expenses for any employment benefits provided. Salaries are reported by rank and by gender.

In addition, a comparison is provided using the average of eleven "peer institutions" for Baker. This peer group was developed as a component of the strategic planning process instituted by the University in 2003. The group includes following institutions:

Adrian College (Adrian, MI), Carroll College (Helena, MT), Central College (Pella, IA), Franklin College (Franklin, IN), Maryville College (Maryville, TN), Monmouth College (Monmouth, IL), Northland College (Ashland, WI), Texas Lutheran University (Seguin, TX), Wartburg College (Waverly, IA), Westminster College (Fulton, MO), and William Jewell College (Liberty, MO).

All data collected for this analysis were obtained from the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) online Peer Analysis System, which accesses information submitted by U.S. post-secondary institutions annually within NCES's Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS).

Figures 12a, 12b, and 12c provide an illustration of the comparisons by gender and with the peer averages for each of the faculty rankings (assistant, associate and full professor). An examination of this graphical information shows a couple trends which, while they may not be completely surprising for some, are nonetheless areas where further attention might be warranted. Namely:

- 1. Baker male faculty members tend to earn higher salaries than female faculty members of the same rank. This is particularly true for those who are within the highest rank (professor), and somewhat less true for those within the middle and lowest ranks (associate and assistant professor, respectively), where for some years (for example, 2004, 2005 and 2006) the average Baker female salary is actually higher than that of Baker male faculty at one of these ranks. Some of this gender disparity may be partly due to differences in salary among different disciplines (e.g., business or physical science disciplines versus those within the humanities). Some of the gender difference seen within the rank of professor might also be a consequence of years within the rank, which tends to be greater for many of our male faculty (longer time as a professor). It is also important to note that Baker is not alone in facing this gender disparity, as similar patterns can be seen within the male and female peer data.
- Baker faculty members tend to have lower average salaries than the average for the eleven
 peer institutions used in this analysis, regardless of rank or gender. Again, this pattern is
 most prominent for salaries within the highest rank and somewhat less dramatic within the
 lowest rank.

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR



ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR



PROFESSOR



Table 13 provides the past five fiscal years (FY) of endowment level data for Baker University along with the eleven "aspirant" and eleven "peer" institutions for Baker (both groups were developed as a component of the strategic planning process instituted by the University in 2003). Figure 13 provides an illustration of the annual endowment growth rates for Baker and group averages for these growth rates for the aspirant and peer institutions. These data indicate that both aspirant and peer institutions experienced a slowing of endowment growth in the FY 2004-2005 and FY 2005-2006 periods, as Baker did in FY 2005-2006.

Reflecting national trends in overall market performance, average growth rates for both comparison groups and Baker were negative for FY 07-08, though Baker's negative rate was somewhat larger in magnitude (-9.0% compared to group averages of -7.1% and -3.5% for aspirant and peer institutions, respectively).

Looking at the total growth experienced since July 2002, the net change of Baker's endowment from July 2002 to June 2008 was 23.7%. While this percentage is lower than either of the two group averages for this period (35.0% and 52.6% for aspirant and peer institutions, respectively), it is larger than the comparable growth rate for three of Baker's aspirant schools—Earlham College (12.1%), Franklin and Marshall College (16.1%), and Southwestern University (4.0%)—and two of Baker's peer schools—Adrian College (5.3%) and Carroll College (21.7%). By contrast, one of Baker's peer schools (Texas Lutheran University) was able to more than double its endowment during this period (from \$30.0 million to \$65.7 million), and another (Maryville College) nearly achieved this goal (its endowment grew 88.8% from July 2002 to June 2008, from \$23.0 million to \$43.4 million).



Glossary of Terms

20th-Day Numbers

Since most enrollment data fluctuate throughout an academic term, for the purposes of official reporting, the U.S. Department of Education asks that all schools (K-I2 and higher education) determine their enrollment levels on a standardized day, typically the twentieth day of the term. Thus most data that are reported within higher education are "20th-day" numbers. Further, given that most colleges and universities also experience a predictable reduction in enrollment in the spring term relative to the fall, it is the fall term's "20th day" numbers that are most commonly used to reflect the enrollment for a given academic year. This convention is followed throughout the reports within this document, unless otherwise noted.

First year (first time) cohort

The first year (first time) cohort is determined at the start of each fall semester and is comprised of all students who are entering college "for the first time." This group includes students who might have completed college credit while also enrolled in high school (e.g., College Now or dual enrollment with a local junior college).

FTE or "full-time equivalent"

For the reports within this document, full-time equivalent for undergraduate students is defined as fifteen credit hours per semester. For graduate students it is nine credit hours per semester. The full-time equivalent for faculty is twelve credit hours per semester.

Full-time student

For the reports within this document, full-time status for undergraduate students is defined as twelve credit hours per semester. For graduate students, this is nine credit hours per semester. Students who are enrolled in fewer than the total necessary for full-time status are considered part-time.

Graduation rate

Most national reporting agencies ask us to use a "six-year" graduation rate, based on the first year cohort of the most recent class to have completed six consecutive years at Baker. Thus most advertised "graduation rates" are based on a six-year time frame and only include "first year" students (transfer students are excluded). NOTE: If a member of a given first year cohort leaves Baker but then resumes his or her studies at Baker and graduates within six years of their first semester of attendance, they are included in the six-year graduated pool for that cohort.

Percentile

"One of a set of points on a scale arrived at by dividing a group into parts in order of magnitude. For example, a score equal to or greater than 97 percent of those attained on an examination is said to be in the 97th percentile."

Glossary of Terms

Retention rate

A student is considered "retained" from semester I to semester 2 if he or she either graduates at the end of semester I or is enrolled in at least one credit hour as of the 20th day of semester 2. While we have presented a variety of retention rates within Exhibits 5 and 6 above, most national reporting agencies use a "first-year" retention rate, based on the first year cohort of the most recent class to have completed a full year (the "freshman-to-sophomore" rate). To be in this "retained pool," a student must continue to be enrolled the following fall semester (the fall of the sophomore year). Thus most advertised "retention rates" are based on a one-year time frame (fall to spring to following fall) and only include "first year" students (transfer students are excluded). NOTE: If a member of a given first year cohort leaves Baker for the spring semester of their first year, but then resumes his or her studies at Baker the following fall, they are included in the one-year retained pool for that cohort.

Semester

A semester at Baker University is defined as a sixteen week academic term. Typically there are two such semesters each academic year. The fall semester begins in mid or late August and ends in mid or late December. The spring semester begins in mid or late January and ends in mid or late May.

Student-faculty ratio

Student-faculty ratios are calculated using a ratio of the FTE data (student FTE / faculty FTE).
