

**MINOR AREA OF CONCENTRATION**  
**2016-2017 Baker University Catalog**

Students wishing to minor in a given discipline must meet the minor requirements outlined by that department in the catalog. If specific courses required for a minor are not designated by a given department, a minimum of 12 semester hours of coursework in that department, 3 of which must be numbered 300 or above, is required for a minor.

**ACCOUNTING** - AC141, AC142, EC242 (all three courses must be completed with a grade of 'C-' or higher); and 6 additional hours in accounting. *(15 credit hours)*

**ART** - AE110, AH 111, AH 495 and any two AS courses *(15 credit hours)*

**BIOLOGY** – Two biology courses at the 100-200 level, each of which must have a laboratory component. Two biology courses at the 300-level, one of which must be a lab course. All courses for the minor must be completed with a grade of 'C' or higher. Students must submit a plan for the minor to the department chair for approval. *(15-16 credit hours)*

**BUSINESS** - AC141, BS141, EC242, and 6 additional credit hours from the following: BS251, BS271, BS353, BS355, BS381 (all except BS355 must be completed with a grade of 'C-' or higher). *(15 credit hours)*

**CHEMISTRY** – CH137 & CH137L, CH138, CH140, CH251, CH252, and three credit hours of upper-college work in chemistry. *(20 credit hours)*

**COACHING** – EX180 (1 hr), EX244, EX245, SA348, SA420 *(13 credit hours)*

**COMMUNICATION STUDIES** – CO242, CO245, CO257, and two upper college communication courses. *(15 credit hours)*

**COMPUTER SCIENCE** - CS175, CS185, CS223, and two of the following courses: CS226, CS335, CS341, CS371, CS392. At least one course must be numbered 300 or above. *(18-19 credit hours)*

**CONFLICT MANAGEMENT** – CO242, CO257 and CO337; three hours from the following: CO237, CO355, CO467; and three hours from the following: EC151, PY386, SO346, SO380. *(15 credit hours)*

**CREATIVE WRITING**- EN152, nine hours from the following courses: EN130, EN232, EN234, EN353, EN365, and three hours from the following: EN375, EN450, EN499 (independent study upon approval). (Students minoring in English are not eligible for this minor.) *(15 credit hours)*

**ECONOMICS** - EC242, EC243, EC346 (all three courses must be completed with a grade of 'C-' or higher); and 6 additional hours in economics. (If used for the minor, EC400 and EC464 must be completed with a grade of 'C-' or higher.) *(15 credit hours)*

**ENGLISH** - EN152, 3 hours at the 200-level or above, 3 hours of upper-college, and 6 additional hours at any level, of which only 3 hours may be a 100-level (EN12x) *literature* course. **EN100 (or any English Composition course) and EN262 do not count toward the minor.** *(15 credit hours)*

**EXERCISE SCIENCE** – One of the following courses: BI246, BI360, BI382; all of the following courses: EX180, EX244, EX343 and EX347. (Students majoring in Physical Education/Health (teacher licensure) are not eligible for this minor.) *(14 credit hours)*

**FRENCH** - *12 hours* in French at the 204-level or above of which 3 hours must be upper-college.

**GENDER STUDIES** – GS210, 6 hours from the following: IN212, PH120, PH290 (topic must be Feminism or related topic), PY168, RE240; 6 additional hours from the following: EN460, HI335, HI348, PH310, PH350, PS310, PS350, PS314, RE415, RE425, SO328, SO329. Note: Student cannot take more than 6 hours in any one prefix toward completion of the minor. Students must submit a plan for completion of the minor to the Gender Studies director for approval. *(15 credit hours)*

**GERMAN** - *12 hours* in German at the 204-level or above of which 3 hours must be upper-college.

**HISTORY** - 1) one of the following: HI140, HI141, HI142, HI143; 2) HI127 or HI128; 3) HI297 or HI298; 4) one of the following: HI333, HI334, HI335, HI344, HI346, HI348, HI349, HI362, HI364; 5) 3 additional hours of upper-college history. *(15 credit hours)*

**MASS MEDIA** – Each of the following courses: MM140, MM250, MM331 (a grade of "C" or higher is required in all 3 of the previously listed courses); and 6 additional hours of mass media, 3 of which must be upper-college. (If used for the minor, MM205, MM230, MM232,, MM 376, MM476 and MM478 must be completed with a grade of 'C' or higher.) *(15 credit hours)*

**MATHEMATICS** - MA171 and MA172 and two courses (at least 6 hours) from the following: MA271, MA281, MA291, courses numbered MA300 or above (excluding MA321, MA330 & MA345). At least one math course must be numbered 300 or above. *(14-16 credit hours)*

**MUSIC** – 18 hours required in two areas: 1) Music Theory & History: MU151, MU153, MU157, MU164, MU331 or MU332. 2) Music Performance: Applied Private Lessons-MU2XX/MU4XX(4 hrs), must pass Achievement Level I by jury examination, and Large Music Ensembles-MU2XX/MU4XX (4 hrs).

**MUSIC THEATRE** – MU207 (1hr), MU217/MU417 (3 hr) -- (enrollment in a choral ensemble is waived UNLESS the student is receiving a choral scholarship), MU237 (2 hrs), MU332 OR TH320 (3 hrs), TH123/TH423 (2 hrs), TH130 (3 hrs), TH200 (3 hrs). (NOTE: Students majoring in Music/Music Education or Theatre are not eligible for this minor.) *(17 credit hours)*

**MUSIC THEATRE PERFORMANCE** – (Voice emphasis. Open to voice student's only) MU237 (2 hrs), TH123/TH423 (2 hrs), TH130, TH200, TH320. *(13 credit hours)*

**PHILOSOPHY** - 12 hours in philosophy, 3 of which must be upper-college.

**PHYSICS** - PC225, PC226, PC325, and 1 additional upper-college physics course. *(15-16 credit hours)*

**POLITICAL SCIENCE** – PS115, PS117, PS212, and 6 additional hours of upper-level political science courses. *(15 credit hours)*

**PRE-LAW** – 18 hours of the following interdisciplinary coursework of which 9 must be upper level: PH110 and QS411 (QS section must be one dealing with a law-focused topic); Four of the following courses with no more than 2 courses in any one department prefix: BS251, BS252, MM478, PH120, PH211, PH350, PS421, SA351, SO346, SO380, law-related special topics/ independent study/Interterm/internship approved by Program Director. (Available to all students regardless of catalog year.)

**PRE-PROFESSIONAL MINISTRY**- BS141, CO245, EN365 or EN353, RE101, SO115; and three credit hours of the following: CO337, HI363, HI443, PY386, RE345, RE363. *(18 credit hours)*

**PRIMARY TEXTS** – PT/QS212 People of the Book, four of the following courses (no more than 2 courses in any one prefix): CO420, CO467, EC450, ED262, ED362, any EN course except the following: ~~EN100, EN152, EN234, EN341, EN363, EN409, EN460~~, FR360, GN360, GN413, GS201, HI226, HI333, IN212, IN401, MM376, PH201, PH202, PH228, PH/RE329, PH270, PH290, PH320, PH322, PS260, PS314, PS315, PY371, RE110, RE120, RE140, RE240, RE415, RE460, RE480, SP360, SP413, SP414, SP416, SP418, TH320, TH330. *(15 credit hours)*

**PSYCHOLOGY** - 15 hours in psychology at any level.

**PUBLIC RELATIONS**- MM260, MM261, MM331(grade of C required), MM340, and MM470 (This minor is not available to Mass Media majors pursuing the Public Relations or Sports Media Tracks) *(15 credit hours)*

**RELIGIOUS STUDIES** - 12 hours in religion to include, RE101 and a 3 hour upper-college religious studies course.

**SOCIAL JUSTICE** – SJ210 & SJ493; two Source courses selected from the following: AH250, CO420, EC111, EN226, HI333, HI334, HI348, PS212, SO243, SO329, SO330, SO331, SO410; two Solutions courses selected from the following: CO257, CO355, CO467, EC151, PH/PS310, SO337. *(18 credit hours)*

**SOCIOLOGY** - SO115, one 200-level course, two courses numbered 300 or above, and one additional sociology course numbered 200 or above. *(15 credit hours)*

**SPANISH** - 12 hours in Spanish at the 204-level or above of which 3 must be upper-college.

**SPORTS ADMINISTRATION**- 12 hours of Sports Administration (SA prefix), 3 of which must be upper-college.

**THEATRE** - TH111, TH130, TH145, TH280 or TH123, TH320 or TH330, and three additional hours of theatre. *(16 credit hours)*
