Courses numbered 1-17 are the required nursing pre-requisite courses. Additional courses are CAS requirements.

CAS Priority Admission Policy

Students from the Baker University CAS will be eligible for priority admission to the Baker School of Nursing (SON) if they meet the following criteria in addition to meeting admission requirements as stated in the current SON catalog at the time of application:

1. Meet the residency requirement of 40 or more hours from Baker University
2. Have at least 12 hours of science credit, including Human Anatomy and Physiology I & II, from the CAS
3. Once a student at CAS, all science courses must be taken at CAS.
4. Have an overall prerequisite cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 in the required pre-requisites (courses 1-17) AND a math/science GPA of at least 3.0

Applicants who do not meet criteria for priority admission will be considered for admission with all other applicants.

* Humanities include courses in Literature, History, Foreign Language, Sign Language, Art, Music, Theater, Dance, Religion, Sociology, Anthropology, Government, Geology or Geography and QS212. A maximum of six hours in any one area will apply towards the pre-nursing curriculum. QS212 is required.

Completion of QS111, QS112, and QS211 will exempt students from completion of Oral Communication (CO115) as well as English Composition I and II as pre-requisites for the School of Nursing.

** Students must use either interterm or a Humanities course to gain experience with a global/intercultural perspective.

*** If EN100 is needed, it can serve as the elective course towards the total hours required for admission

**** MA090/091 do not count for college credit but are required for entrance into MA145 and MA221 if the student's ACT score is less than 22.
